

Brief History

Emerald was formed in 1967 as Management Consultants Bradford (MCB) by a group of academics dissatisfied by the publishing outlets of the time. By 1981 the company had grown to 20 employees and was publishing 15 journals. In 1984 company expansion resulted in a move to new premises on Toller Lane, Bradford. By 1990 it was publishing 65 journals. MCB was


renamed Emerald in 2001. In 2007 Emerald acquired a programme of Management and Social Science book serials, series and monographs from Elsevier. The acquisition of health and social care publisher Pier Professional Limited took place in 2011. In 2014 Emerald was one of several publishers to sign a deal to partner with Kudos, a service that helps increase the impact of published articles. In quarter 3 of 2014, Emerald Insight was transferred to Atypon's Literatum platform. In July 2015, Emerald announced a green open access zero month embargo trial. Emerald partnered with CLOCKSS Archive in 2015 to preserve ejournals and ebooks.

Scope and Coverage

Emerald eJournals includes over 120,000 articles from nearly 300 journals. The eJournal product is a cross disciplinary journal database including peer-reviewed, international research in both established and emerging areas of interest. Emerald's portfolio also contains over 2,650 books and book series volumes in specialist fields such as Business & Management, Education, Engineering, Library Studies and Marketing.

Kind of Information


This tool provides bibliographic information of books, book series and journals. Information includes name of editors/authors, title name, publishing year, ISBN, e-ISBN, ISSN, e-ISSN etc with cover photo. With each entry synopsis, table of contents also included. Some example is given below for clear understanding.
