Scope and Coverage Chemistry is a branch of physical science that studies the composition, structure,

properties and change of matter. Chemistry includes topics such as the properties of individual atoms, how atoms form chemical bonds to create chemical compounds, the interactions of substances through intermolecular forces that give matter its general properties, and the interactions between substances through chemical reactions to form different substances. This site contains the biography of notable chemists and information about significant innovation of them.
