


Brief History

The institution, based in Bengaluru, in the south Indian state of Karnataka, started functioning with Dr. Raja Ramanna as its founder director.

Scope and Coverage

National Institute of Advanced Studies (NIAS) is a centre of higher learning in India engaged in interdisciplinary and multidisciplinary research in natural sciences, social sciences, arts and humanities. It was founded by J. R. D. Tata in 20 June 1988. The main objective of NIAS library has been to develop a well-balanced collection of books across disciplines in which our faculty is actively engaged in research. According to the library website the collection includes more than 16,500 books, 55 print journals, 3736 online journals, 2200 back volumes of journals and a small collection of CDs, DVDs, audio and video recordings. NSS and Census datasets on CDs have been acquired recently. As an associate member of UGC-Infonet Digital Library Consortium, the Library subscribes to journal collections of OUP, CUP, Taylor and Francis and JSTOR. Over the years, the research activities of the Institute have grown manifold and the library has been trying to keep pace with the expanding aims and activities of the Institute. The Library participates in resource sharing activities with all the major Libraries of Bangalore and elsewhere. The Library is an open reference Library and attracts a number of scholars from everywhere.

Kind of Information

The primary mission of the library is to support the educational and research programmes of the University by providing physical and intellectual access to information. The library provides following type of search facilities for its users:

- Simple search:
- Advanced search;
- Additional search;
- Browsing of collection;
- Searching by ISBN;
- Searching by accession number;
- Full text search

In simple search process, users are able to search for documents by mentioning bibliographic fields like author, title, subject, ISBN, series, place of publication, publisher.

The user can make a simple search using this option also. The fields to be entered are Database, Field, Enter word(s) or phrase, Connector, Specify Year(s) of Publication etc. The following screen shots show it:



The search result can be sorted by the options like Title, Author, Call No., year of publication (ascending or descending) etc.



The above search process produces a list of relevant documents to the search query. In this list users can access limited kind of bibliographic information namely Title of the work, name of the author, call number. All the titles in that list are hyperlinked with its bibliographic information which is presented at the right side of the web page. In this format bibliographic information mainly the title, author's name, edition, publication place, year and publisher, physical description, call number, subject are provided. The following screen shot shows it in details:



Special Features

- ➤ Literature Search Service from collection of books, articles and from CD-ROMS etc. are provided;
- ➤ The library website provides current awareness services of new arrivals are provided.
- ➤ NIAS includes open access repositories. This open access institutional repository of NIAS collects preserves and disseminates in digital format the research output and other scholarly publications created by the NIAS research community.
- The OPAC page contains external links to OCLC database.
- Users are able to give feedback for this library through email.

Arrangement Pattern	Users are given opportunity to choose pattern of arrangement of books in search list. The list can be arranged or rearranged by title or Author (alphabetical arrangement), Call No. (alphanumeric arrangement), year of publication (ascending or descending) etc.
