

- Military & Government**: Local, national and international governments, military, defense, defense industry, weapons systems, etc. (over 154,000 definitions). Examples: DoD, ICBM, ICE, NHS, MoD, NOAA, NSA, OSHA, NZQA
- Organizations & Schools**: Local, national, and international organizations, schools, colleges, universities, education, non-profits, NGOs, etc. (over 195,000 definitions). Examples: ALA, ANWB, BBB, IEEE, MoMA, NEA, UCLA, UN, WTO

Scope and Coverage



- ❖ Clicking on the “magnifying glass” sign denoting search option, one can find a detailed searching facility from the Google search engine.
- ❖ A word game WordHub is also linked with this site.

Arrangement Pattern

Entries are arranged alphabetically. Under a particular alphabet the entries are arranged in alphabetical sequence. For example under ‘D’ the entries are arranged in the following order- [DCM](#), [DCM-M](#), [DCM-NJ](#), [DCM-NJ+MP](#), [DCMA](#), [DCMA-I](#), [DCMAA](#) etc. Under ‘#’ the terms

starting with Arabic numerals and various signs are arranged. E.g.: 101D, 102, 1040, 1080i, 1080p and *G*, +EV, +FC, +SHE, -EV, -NMR etc.
