Obama Thinks He Could Have Beaten Trump

Washington (dpa) - President Barack Obama, who leaves office January 20, believes he could have won a third mandate in the White House if not for constitutional term limits, he said in an interview released Monday.

In a White House interview for an internet podcast with David Axelrod, a CNN political commentator who managed Obama's campaigns in 2008 and 2012, the president insisted that his left-leaning policies could have still been successful in the 2016 election.

President-elect Donald Trump fired back on Twitter shortly afterwards rubbing Obama's claim: "President Obama said that he thinks he would have won against me. He should say that but I say NO WAY! - jobs leaving, ISIS, OCare, etc."

The US constitutional limit of two four-year terms prevented the 55-year-old Obama from seeking re-election. Instead, the Democratic Party nominated his former secretary of state, Hillary Clinton, who narrowly lost in an upset to right-wing populist Donald Trump.

Obama told Axelrod that there was a cultural shift during his presidency, despite the outcome of the November 8 election.

"The majority does buy into the notion of a one America that is tolerant and diverse and open and full of energy and dynamism," he said.

"And the problem is, it doesn't always manifest itself in politics, right? You know, I am confident in this vision because I'm confident that if I had run again and articulated it, I think I could've mobilized a majority of the American people to rally behind it."

Clinton, a former first lady, "performed wonderfully under really tough circumstances" and suffered a "double standard ... that meant her flaws were wildly amplified," Obama said
