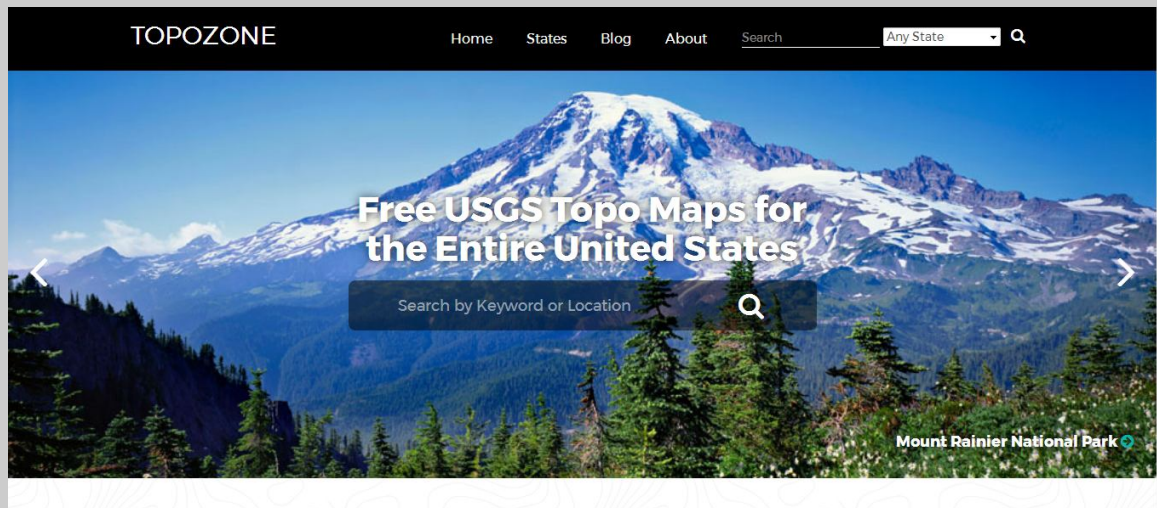

Brief History TopoZone is a website operated by Locality LLC that offers free online topographic maps. It was founded in November 1999 by Ed McNierney whose company Maps a la carte, Inc. operated out of North Chelmsford, Massachusetts.

Scope and Coverage TopoZone was one of the first topographic mapping site on the web, providing visitors

with free viewing and printing of the full set of United States Geological Survey topographic maps covering the entire United States. The maps are produced by the USGS, which encourages the distribution of their maps through business partners. TopoZone offered aerial photographs from the USGS and street maps from the United States Census Bureau. In 2007 complete coverage of Canada was added, using the topographic map series produced by Natural Resources Canada. This site also contains mountain map, top 10 more visited national parks etc.

Kind of Information

Click on the navigation man and drag on the map that represents street view of the area. “Satellite” gives the satellite view where user can zoom in and out using the +/- zoom button or by using middle mouse roller. Photos of area, well known places are shown with changes of the direction of navigation map.



Special Features

- ❖ Peak, mountain, hill also can be viewed by navigation map.

Arrangement Pattern

Entries are arranged alphabetically by name of the state of United States.

Remarks

This is important reference tool which provides road maps, photos, satellite views etc. This tool is helpful for get direction. Mountain, hill views are also presented.
