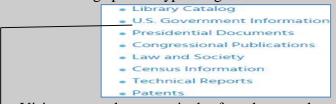

## Kind of Information

The documents that are mentioned in the Scope and coverage area are discussed here to know the kind of information that can be accessed from here.

**U.S. Government Documents:** UCSB is a selective depository for U.S. Government publications. The Government Printing Office provides government information at no cost to designated depository libraries throughout the country. These libraries, in turn, provide local, no-fee access to government information in all formats in an impartial environment with professional assistance. Any member of the public may visit these depository libraries and use the Federal depository collections.

Most publications can be identified through the library catalog. Many recent U.S. government documents are now available online. It also has subject guides to assist users in locating specific types of government information:

California Documents: The UCSB Library has been a complete depository for

California State publications since 1972 and a selective depository since the 1950s. The collection consists of publications covering a broad range of topics such as water quality, air pollution, bilingual education, AIDS, welfare, the budget, annual reports from California state agencies, legislative materials, statistical information, crime, and health issues.

Most publications can be identified through our library catalog or through our subject guides. Most recent California documents are now available online.

Foreign International Documents: The UCSB Library actively collects documents published by many international governmental organizations such as the United Nations, World Bank, International Monetary Fund, Organization for Economic Co-operation and Development, World Health Organization, and the European Communities. International publications can be located through the library catalog and subject guides. United Nations Documents are not individually cataloged, but are housed in a microfiche collection in the Government Information Many recent publications are available online. It also collects major statistical publications from selected foreign countries. These can be located by using the library catalog. With the exception of microform documents, foreign government documents are housed in the main library collection.

Documents from international non-governmental organizations are cataloged and housed in the main library, or are available online.

**Local government Documents:** The UCSB Library collects selective publications issued by local area government agencies. These include publications on topics such as planning, environmental impact reports (EIRs), land use, beach erosion, local county and city budgets, and statistical information. Most recent documents are available online.

Materials in the Local Documents Collection can be identified using the UCSB Library catalog. They are shelved on the 2nd floor (Mountainside) near the Paseo bridge. Many of these publications can be checked out.

**International Documents:** The UCSB Library actively collects documents published by many international governmental organizations such as the United Nations, World Bank, International Monetary Fund, Organisation for Economic Cooperation and Development, World Health Organization, and the European Communities.
