	The Ministry is headed by the cabinet-ranked Minister of Human Resources Development, a member of the Council of Ministers.
Scope and Coverage	 Currently, the MHRD works through two departments: Department of School Education & Literacy Department of Higher Education While the Department of School Education & Literacy is responsible for development of school education and literacy in the country, the Department of Higher Education takes care of what is one of the largest Higher Education systems of the world, just after the United States and China. The Dept.of School Education & Literacyhas its eyes set on the "universalization of education" and making better citizens out of young brigade. For this, various new schemes and initiatives are taken up regularly and recently, those schemes and initiatives have also started paying dividends in the form of growing enrolment in schools. The Dept.of Higher Education, on the other hand, is engaged in bringing world class opportunities of higher education and research to the country so that Indian students are not finding lacking when facing an international platform. For this, the government has launched joint ventures and signed MoUs to help the Indian student benefit from the world opinion.
