Scope and Coverage	The <i>Handbook of Pragmatics Online</i> places the field of research known as pragmatics at its center of interest. It consists of topical articles (from anaphora and bilingualism to codes witching, cohesion, discourse markers, implicitness, mass media, negation, social institutions, and terms of address) and brief biographies of eminent scholars (such as Austin, Bühler, Grice, Morris, Sapir). In addition, it offers an extensive overview of research traditions that belong or have contributed to pragmatics (from accommodation theory, analytical philosophy and anthropological linguistics, to cognitive linguistics, construction grammar, conversation analysis, discourse analysis, literary pragmatics, neurolinguistics, psycholinguistics, relevance theory, sociolinguistics, speech act theory, and universal and transcendental pragmatics, to name just a few), of research methods (from contrastive analysis and corpus analysis to ethnography, experimentation, logical analysis, statistics, and taxonomy), and of notation systems (from formal semantics to transcription systems for spoken discourse).	
Kind of Information	The <i>Handbook of Pragmatics</i> provides up-to-date information on research in the field of linguistic pragmatics, conceived as the interdisciplinary (cognitive, social, and cultural) science of natural language use. The articles of this handbook disseminate the knowledge about pragmatic aspects of language and stimulates various <i>fields of application</i> , ranging from language teaching and problems of intercultural communication to the construction of computer communication systems and the treatment of patients with language disorders, by making this knowledge accessible to an interdisciplinary community of scholars approaching the same general subject area from different points of view and with different methodologies. All the articles include huge number of references and linked with related articles in this handbook. The text of this article includes notes.	
Special Features	 This handbook is expanded and revised annually. It offers reference interlinking through CrossRef DOIs. The index available here is analysis-driven: it is not so much based on words and phrases that occur literally in the contributions to the <i>Handbook</i>; rather, it provides a conceptual road map with extensive cross-referencing. The <i>Handbook of Pragmatics Online</i> incorporates all information from the <i>Handbook of Pragmatics</i> (Manual & Installments). Future online versions will add further entries, and will include updates, rewritings and extensive revisions of already available entries. 	

Arrangement Pattern	The contents of this handbook are subdivided into headings like General Topics, Traditions, Linguistic Scholars, Methods, and Notational Systems. Underlying articles are arranged alphabetically. Although users can browse the articles from alphabetic list of all articles. At the left pane of the web page, there is an option namely "Handbook". By clicking that option, one can find the above hyperlinked headings. The content of the handbook can be browsed through these options.
Remarks	This electronic reference tool of one of the major fields of language studies is a continuously updatable source of state-of-the-art information for anyone interested in language use. The <i>Handbook of Pragmatics Online</i> is variously searchable and flexible to meet the needs of both beginners and established scholars in the field.
