


*Scope and Coverage* The current selection of the AGSL Digital Photo Archive - Africa focuses on the countries of southern and eastern Africa. The coverage of this digital collection will expand as more photos are added to the site.

*Kind of Information* AGSL Digital Photo Archive - Africa presents a selection of images from the extensive photographic holdings of the American Geographical Society (AGS) Library. These images were selected from the Richard U. Light and Mary (Light) Meader Collection.

This digital collection contains approximately 1080 images from Mary Upjohn Light's aerial photography in 1937-38. Mrs. Light was an adventurous aerial photographer who flew with Dr. Richard Upjohn Light, a geographer and pilot, over the continents of South America and Africa. They were the first to produce aerial photographs of these continents. Some of the first aerial photographs of the pyramids in Egypt are present in the Light/Meader Collection of negatives. The negatives, and accompanying photos and photography logs, are housed at the American Geographical Society Library and were scanned as part of the 2010-2012 NEH Grant Project to digitize the library's collection of nitrate negatives.

A reproduction fee is charged for high-resolution, preservation-quality copies in TIFF format.
