Brief History	Founded in 1972 by Harriet Bridgeman, the Bridgeman Art Library cooperates with many art galleries and museums to gather images and footage for licensing. By the early 90s, work has begun on a digital database of every image in the collection. 1996 sees Bridgeman specialists team up with scientists to develop ways

of making images more accessible. Bridgeman's first fully searchable website launches in April 1999 and is now regarded as one of the web's most significant cultural resources, providing content for the Grove Macmillan Dictionary of Art Online and ArtWeb, an online gateway to museum collections built in collaboration with Réunion des Musées Nationaux.


Scope and Coverage The Bridgeman Art Library, based in London, Paris, New York, and Berlin, provides one of the largest archives for reproductions of works of art in the world. For over forty years Bridgeman Images has been working with museums from around the world. From large museums to galleries, historical societies to universities, many of the treasures in these collections had never been made readily accessible to a wider audience until they were photographed specifically for Bridgeman to make available for reproduction.

## *Kind of Information* The Bridgeman Art Library is a company that represents museums, art collections and artists throughout the world by providing a central source of fine art and photography for image users.



The Bridgeman Art Library provides links to the world's best art museums and art galleries. Users can access images from these art museums.




It also provides categories of some conceptual images. Inspirational selections of conceptual imagery and visual design trends from the spectrum of art history and beyond to help users find the perfect image.
