A service of the Colorado State Library, the Colorado Historic Newspapers Collection (CHNC) currently includes more than 909,000 digitized pages, representing more than 200 individual newspaper titles published in Colorado primarily from 1859 to 1923. Due to copyright restrictions, the CHNC does not generally include newspapers published after 1922, but the CHNC can digitize beyond 1922 if publisher permission can be secured.

Ongoing support for maintaining and providing access to the CHNC is paid for with state funds administered by the Colorado State Library. We continue to add new pages to the CHNC when community funding is located to pay the costs of digitization.

Brief History

CHNC began as a joint endeavor of the Colorado State Library, History Colorado, and the Collaborative Digitization Program (CDP). CHNC was started with two grants awarded to the CDP totaling \$370,000 — a Library Services and Technology Act (LSTA) grant provided by the Colorado State Library and an Institute for Museum and Library Services (IMLS) grant. These grants provided funding to license the original software, purchase the hardware that hosts the newspaper images

and database, and to digitize around 97,000 pages of newspapers. These grants ended September 30, 2005.

Scope and Coverage

Includes over 909,000 digitized pages from more than 200 newspapers published in Colorado from 1859 to 1923.


Kind of Information

A service of the Colorado State Library, the Colorado Historic Newspapers Collection (CHNC) currently includes more than 909,000 digitized pages, representing more than 200 individual newspaper titles published in Colorado primarily from 1859 to 1923. Due to copyright restrictions, the CHNC does not generally include newspapers published after 1922, but the CHNC can digitize beyond 1922 if publisher permission can be secured. Digitization of additional newspapers continues through a local fund-raising model with contributions made by local libraries, archives, museums, and other organizations. Newspapers are digitized from microfilm or from the original newspaper. CHNC uses Veridian Software, which was designed specifically for providing access to digitized newspapers.

Contains long runs of titles such as Akron Weekly Pioneer Press (1888-1923), Aspen Times Weekly (1881-1933), Colorado Transcript (1866-1930), Daily Journal (Telluride) (1896-1923), Fort Collins Courier (1878-1923), Rocky Mountain News (1860-1879), and Svensk Amerikanska Western (1890-1928).

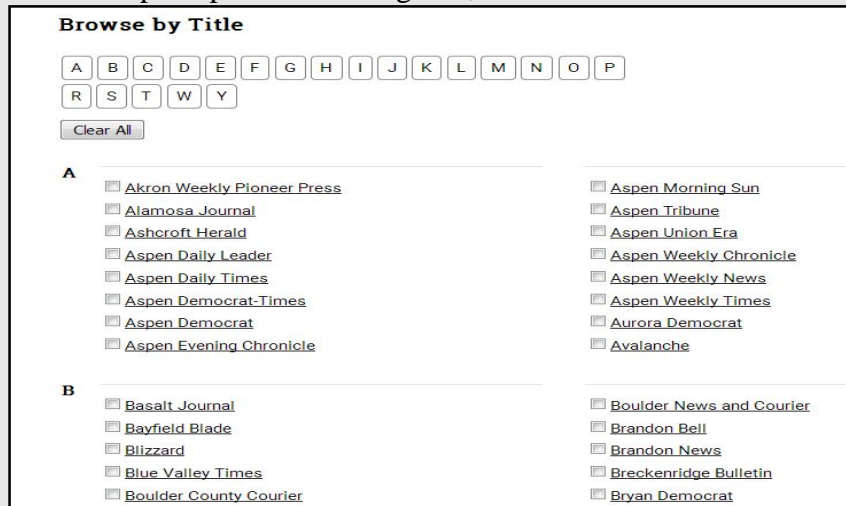

- ❖ **Enlarging the Text:** The initial display of any newspaper page selected from the search results will be very small, but it is easy to enlarge the entire page to be viewed, or zoom into a selected article. To enlarge the text, use the enlarge or shrink buttons in the upper right corner of the page display.

Arrangement Pattern All the titles are arranged alphabetically. To see the alphabetical list of the titles select Title under browse by categories -

Remarks Newspapers are one of the most versatile and heavily used sources of information for researchers, students and the general public. Feature stories, society news, classified and picture advertisements, school and church announcements, news from surrounding towns, editorials and cartoons, all give the reader the sense of “being there”. Often the papers contain historical information that is not available in any other source.

The long term goal for CHNC is to house digital representations of all of Colorado’s earliest published newspapers beginning with those from 1859 and continuing through 1923.
