

Brief History

Michigan State University (MSU) is a public research university in East Lansing, Michigan, United States. MSU was founded in February 12, 1855, and then became the nation's first land-grant institution under the Morrill Act of 1862, serving as a model for future land-grant universities.


Electronic Resources: Newspapers

Access World News, Research Collection (NewsBank):

This comprehensive news collection (1903 to date) is ideal for exploring issues and events at the local, regional, national and international level. Its diverse source types include print and online-only newspapers, blogs, newswires, journals, broadcast transcripts and videos. Use it to explore a specific event or to compare a wide variety of viewpoints on topics such as politics, business, health, sports, cultural activities and people. Content is easily searched and sorted through an intuitive, map-based interface. Click on the Michigan Sources tab for a list of 156 options.

 - Life Photo Archive Hosted by Google: Users can search millions of photographs from the LIFE photo archive, stretching from the 1750s to today. Most were never published and are now available for the first time through the joint work of LIFE and Google.
 - Library of Congress Newspaper Images via Flicker: In 2008, the Library of Congress began offering historical photograph collections through Flickr in order to share some of their most popular images with a new visual community. Now, the Library of Congress has expanded its Flickr collections to include illustrated and visual content from historic American newspapers available in its online collections.
