	The Newspapers and Journals Department has approximately 2,000 different Belgi newspaper titles in its repository. These newspapers belong to the collection "J.H ( <i>Journaux belges</i> or Belgian newspapers), which covers the period from the 1 years of the eighteenth century up to today.					
	In addition, there are around 500 different foreign newspaper titles in broadsheet format (grande presse), either as original copies or on microfilm.					
	Lastly, there are a few collections of precious works, such as the Gaston Merter Collection, which has more than 60,000 specimens from some 1,650 Belgia municipalities (dating from the mid-seventeenth century to 1948), and the Philipp Vandermaelen Collection, which contains 2,405 specimens of nineteenth centur foreign newspapers (mostly from Europe and the United States).


