Brief History It was established in 1947 with its headquarters in Bangkok, Thailand.

Scope and Coverage The ESCAP Statistical database provides a regional perspective on development issues in Asia and the Pacific. It contains over 350 indicators disaggregated into over 1200 data series organized in 16 domains. SDG global indicators for which data is available have been incorporated into the ESCAP database. It provides quality statistics i.e. relevant, accurate, timely, value for money, accessible to all and free from political interference. Together with the Statistical Institute for Asia and the Pacific (SIAP), ESCAP works with member States to increase their capacity to produce, disseminate and use statistics in accordance with internationally agreed standards.

Kind of Information Data is presented for the 58 regional ESCAP members as well as for a large number of country groupings relevant in analyzing development in the region. Data is sourced from international data sources to ensure comparability across countries and is updated regularly to maintain the database as a comprehensive statistical resource on development in Asia-Pacific. It gives statistics of different subjects. Each of those topics are given with a photograph and brief description as follows:

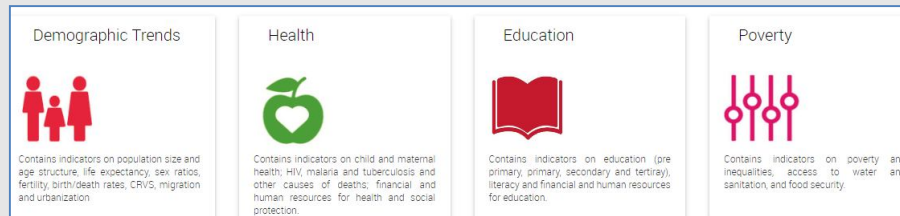


Economic Statistics

Sound economic policy decisions can be made only if they can be backed up by evidence. At a time when economic crises are recurring, the emphasis on having reliable and timely economic data is even stronger.

Each of those also provides information on publication, upcoming events, recent events, highlights, related topics and related links etc.

Different categories are displayed with their respective icons and small description as shown below:



While one of those categories is clicked on, that provides metadata and resultant data. Results are represented both in tabular and pivotal formats. Indicators, years, regions and data series etc. are to be selected wherever needed. As for example, adult/child sex ratios (child population) of Hong Kong, China gives the following result:

Indicator : Adult/child sex ratios-Child population-Child population

Unit : Boys per 100 girls
