

Brief History	On the 50th anniversary of the Organisation for Economic Cooperation and Development (OECD), world leaders and top representatives from business, labour and civil society join OECD Secretary - General Angel Gurría and OECD experts to examine today's pressing issues in the inaugural OECD Yearbook 2011.		
Scope and Coverage	The organization has a pivotal role in addressing the challenges that is facing the world economy. Inclusive growth is a prime area of concern for the OECD and the yearbook encompasses all the relevant issues that affect human development. Energy, poverty, unemployment, gender issues, education, disease, climate change, food security, governance, inequality and much more is covered in the OECD yearbook.  As an organization, OECD is on a mission to better people's lives by developing effective public policies and thus the OECD yearbook focuses on all the areas that are connected to human development. It says about the key social, economic and environmental issues arising out not only of the recent economic crisis but also of ambitious global agreements that are struck over taxation, development and climate change.		
Kind of Information	The yearbooks can be accessed from the OECD forum link found at the bottom of the homepage. The yearbook page is found with the top stories of the latest edition of the yearbook and open publication of the yearbook. By clicking on the link "Click to read" appearing in front of the front cover of the latest edition of the yearbook, the whole of the scanned book can be reached.  Each yearbook has a theme of focus. The content of the publication are sectioned under themes like, "Innovative and productive Economies", "Future societies", "From agreement to action" etc.  The articles are formatted with the article title, name, designation and a photo of the author, a brief indication of the		

content following the main body of text. The main body of the content has excerpts of the content written in bold and bigger font, placed in between paragraphs, graphs, reference source etc. Pictures relevant to the topic are included in the article. Following is an example:



At the end of an article reference sources are provided. At the beginning of each thematic section under which the articles are arranged, a foreword about the theme, brief description of what the writers in this section wanted to say is provided.

At the end of a thematic section, pages from OECD Factbook that depicts charts, graphs of themes like "Infant mortality rate", "Distribution of foreign and international students in tertiary education" etc. is placed. Screenshot of one such page is shown below:

- Link to Facebook, Twitter, youtube, LinkedIn, RSS feed, Email alerts are available at the homepage of OECD.
- Articles of the yearbook are available both as free publication in scanned pages and as regular web content.

#### Arrangement Pattern

From the home page of OECD, the OECD Forum link opens up to the yearbook page. The yearbook is arranged chronologically, as depicted below:

The content of the yearbook is arranged under thematic sections with article titles and author name with their designation. Each item at the content page has a serial number. Apart from articles titles, items like, "OECD Factbook Indicators", "Focus" are placed at the end of the content page.
